THIS WEEK'S WORD OF THE DAY

DAY	WORD	DEFINITION
MONDAY	Understand (verb)	Perceive the intended meaning of (words, a language, or a speaker).
TUESDAY	Hemisphere (noun)	A half of the earth, usually as divided into northern and southern halves by the equator, or into western and eastern halves by an imaginary line passing through the poles.
WEDNESDAY	Encryption (noun)	The process of converting information or data into a code, especially to prevent unauthorised access.
THURSDAY	Tenderise (verb)	Make (meat) more tender by beating or slow cooking.
FRIDAY	Research (noun)	The systematic investigation into and study of materials and sources in order to establish facts and reach new conclusions.
