Dear Parent/Carer

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## **Attendance**

As a City, we have been disproportionately hit with the impacts of the pandemic and this resulted in many students missing numerous days of school over the past year. As we move out of the pandemic and back to normality, it is vital that attendance to school is a key priority for all students next year. The Government has made it very clear in their guidance that it is the parent's/carer's responsibility to ensure their child attends school every day. The Government has also been very clear that all normal systems for monitoring attendance will continue in September. Over the past four years attendance has improved at our Academy and we want to ensure that we continue with that positive trend.

## **COVID guidelines in September**

As you will be aware, the government have made the following changes to the COVID guidance;

- Students and staff will no longer need to isolate if they are a contact of someone who tests positive for COVID-19
- The Academy will no longer run track and trace, this will be run by NHS track and trace
- Masks will not need to be worn at the Academy

Students will still be expected to isolate and take a PCR test if they have COVID-19 symptoms and we will be conducting two tests for children who consent to testing in September. We will use the current consent that you have provided. If you would like to add your consent for testing, please contact the Academy on [info@astn.uk](mailto:info@astn.uk) It is also useful to note that the guidance does state that, if there is an outbreak in a school, we could move back to a situation where close contacts need to isolate and masks need to be worn. You will be immediately informed if this situation arises.

## **Drop off and pick up**

As always, the road outside school can become busy at the start and end of the school day. For the safety of students, parents are no longer permitted to enter the school site via the gates during peak times. If you are dropping your child off by car, please arrange to do so away from the school entrance on Horrocks Avenue or surrounding streets. Parents who enter site within peak times may risk being locked in until all of the students have left site. If your child has specific needs which require you to come on site, please speak to your child's Head of Year. There is plenty of room for students to chain their bike up outside the main Academy building, however, they do so at their own risk. I have also been asked to remind parents that students should not be travelling to school on an E-Scooter, students will not be allowed to store E-scooters on the school site.

## **Uniform Standards and appearance**

You will find enclosed with this letter important information regarding uniform standards and appearance. I urge you to read the updated information very carefully to ensure you do not waste money on uniform items that do not meet our high expectations.

## **Equipment**

All children must come to school equipped and ready to learn. We will have a stationery shop for any students who do not come to school with the relevant equipment. If your child attends without the required stationery including essentials such as: 2 x black or blue pens; green pen; ruler and pencil. School bags will be expected to be able to carry A4 sized books and folders. They should have two straps and be waterproof, to protect exercise books. Students are **not** allowed fashion or handbag type styles. Please refer to the pictorial guidance if you are unsure.

## **Reports**

You will shortly be receiving your child's end of year progress report. This report will give you an overview of the progress made this year. The report will look slightly different this year, to account for the time that has been missed from the school closure in January. There will be guidance accompanying the report to explain this further.

## **Cashless catering**

From September students who pay for their school dinner will no longer be able to top up their account with cash in the Academy. We are moving to fully cashless system, this means parents/carers will need to top up a student's account via ParentPay. More information can be found on: <https://www.parentpay.com>

### **Curriculum for Life**

**We are delighted to be launching our Curriculum for Life programme in September.** We have developed a well sequenced, coherent and interconnected programme that truly has the power to transform lives. Under the tag line of 'Preparing for the tests of life not just a life of tests' we have developed a detailed curriculum including life skills, literacy, collective worship and the development of SMSC that all dovetail under a half termly theme.

- Year Group Collective Worship – The coming together of a year group to worship and reflect on life's big picture and challenges. Clearly linked to the liturgical calendar with a consistent approach being adopted.
- Life Skills – The direct teaching of the PSHE curriculum. Cross referenced against statutory guidance and the needs of our local community.
- Stories for Life – Reading for pleasure. The opportunity to read exciting, age appropriate books modelled by their life tutor. These books are skillfully chosen to pick up some of the themes taught in Life Skills
- Debates & Discussions – Reading of a news article to provoke thought and dialogue. A question is posed beforehand, the article is read, summarised and then reflected upon.
- Moral Dilemmas – The opportunity to discuss how students may respond to a given scenario. There may not be a right or wrong answer and creating further questions is encouraged!
- Aspiring for More – Following the VESPA programme which is a self-reflective scheme giving students the opportunity to break through their targets by considering their Vision, Effort, Systems, Practice and Attitude.
- Future Ambitions – A programme to support the progression routes of our post 16 students. Whether that be to a job, apprenticeship or university they will find the help here.
